These factors change from year to year and vary with each Rutgers school.

However, given the uncertainty of future test dates and availability of standardized tests, **Rutgers will make submission of SAT and ACT test scores optional for students applying for spring or fall 2021 admission.** If students are unable to submit a test score, or choose not to, they will still receive full admission consideration. We conduct a holistic review of each student's application that takes into consideration many more factors than test scores and cumulative grade-point averages. Students who want to submit a standardized test score with their application for 2021 admission may still do so.
